

Public Health Advisory – Drinking Water Warning

Public Water System ID#: AK 2260414

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Drinking Water Program has issued this public health advisory notice for the Cold Bay public water system.

What happened?

City wide power outage caused loss of power to the water treatment plant resulting in loss of water pressure to the distribution system.

What should I do? What does this mean?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for two minutes, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until further notice. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water. Water can be used for handwashing without being boiled.

- *This problem indicates that harmful microbes may be present in your drinking water. Harmful microbes in drinking water can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a special health risk for infants, young children, and people with severely compromised immune systems.*
- The symptoms above are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice. People at increased risk should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

What is being done?

Once power and water pressure has been restored, we will collect three special total coliform bacteria samples and send them to a certified lab for analysis. These samples will help us determine if a problem exists with our water system. If any of the samples are positive for total coliform or E. coli bacteria, we will work to disinfect the water system, flush it, and collect additional samples to verify our system is free from bacterial contamination. In addition, we will adjust our water treatment to insure chlorine levels are consistently being met.

You should not use the drinking water for any potable purpose without boiling it first until further notice. We will notify you when the issue has been resolved and the boil water notice has been rescinded by DEC.

Boil Water Notice

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation Drinking Water Program has issued this notice for all users of the Cold Bay public water system.

This boil water notice is being required due to

City wide power outage caused loss of power to the water treatment plant resulting in loss of water pressure to the distribution system.

Water from this system that is used for drinking, cooking, or other potable purposes should be boiled for 2 minutes prior to use. Boiling the water for 2 minutes will help ensure that the water is adequately treated until satisfactory follow-up sampling has been completed and results reviewed by DEC.

Water can be used for handwashing without being boiled.
